Rain and wind are getting stronger. Rainwater that cannot be fully drained is increasing on the road. The Japan Meteorological Agency has issued a heavy rain warning . The city government has issued an evacuation preparation and evacuation of elderly people and others (alert level 3) advisory. The Japan Meteorological Agency has issued a landslide alert . The city government has issued an evacuation advisory/evacuation order (emergency) (alert level 4). It is likely that the Japan Meteorological Agency will issue an emergency warning later. Disaster!
