

Pre-Evacuation Checklist

You must evacuate now.

Emergency Kit

As a disaster can strike anywhere at any time, we recommend that you prepare an **emergency kit** containing essentials that you can take anywhere at all times. Essentials vary by person, so prepare what you need!

Drill

Do drills before typhoon season!

The items with a drill symbol should be checked and drills should be conducted with your family and people in your community before the typhoon season starts.

Drill

1 Check how to evacuate.

Evacuation by private vehicles will impede the passage of emergency vehicles and cause traffic congestion. If you must evacuate by private vehicle, it is important to start evacuation as early as possible. During heavy rain, it may be impossible to reserve a taxi.

2 Prepare an emergency kit.

As stockpiles at evacuation shelters are limited, it is a good idea to make adequate preparations yourself. A backpack that enables you to keep both hands free is convenient as an emergency bag.

Putting it in a zipper bag will prevent it from getting wet.

3 Reduce damage to your home.

You can use household items to prevent your home from flooding. This is effective when the flooding is light.

How to make simple water bags

Water bags are convenient as they can be stored easily after use.



1 Double line a large bag and fill with water.



2 Close the bag. ※Let out any air.



3 Place cardboard boxes on a tarpaulin and place water bags inside.



4 Wrap the tarpaulin around the boxes.

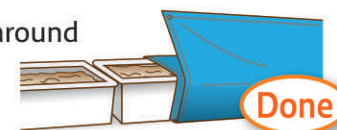


How to make waterstops

Use a long board to prevent flooding.



Wrap a tarpaulin around planters filled with soil.



4 Reduce damage to your assets

Drill

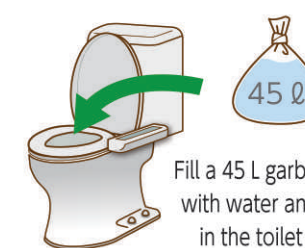
Take important items to higher ground

Move important documents, such as bank books, insurance cards, and passports, movable appliances, and photo albums to a high place where they will not get wet.



Prevent backflow from toilets

During heavy rain, sewerage water may backflow. Putting a water bag in the toilet bowl prevent the backflow of water.



Fill a 45 L garbage bag with water and put it in the toilet bowl.

Start from things you can do

Sweep up fallen leaves and dirt on a daily basis to keep drains clear.



Take advantage of the sandbag station!

Two types of sandbag stations have been set up in the city to prevent damage from flooding and inundation caused by heavy rains. Please pick up sandbags yourself if you need them.

1 Small local sandbag station (always open)



Feel free to use them.



There are 50 sandbags in the station. (Numbers are limited.)

2 Large sandbag stations (only open during heavy rain)



Sandbag stations open in accordance with the situation. When these stations are open, a notification will be posted on the city government's official website or sent via the email information distribution service.
